Good to know:

Wanted to let you know about a significant event that is taking place tomorrow in Manhattan. The Chiaroscuro Foundation, a private organization that supports pro-life initiatives, is sponsoring a press conference to address the appalling abortion rate in New York.

The principal focus of the press conference will be the health statistics recently released by the New York City government. These statistics show that **41% of all pregnancies in New York City end in abortion**. Even worse, **60%** of all African-American pregnancies end in abortion, and among African-American teens the number rises to **72%**.

Archbishop Dolan will head the press conference, along with representatives of Protestant and Jewish organizations, and other civic leaders. They will discuss various ways in which the religious communities and ordinary citizens can respond to this tragedy which devastates our communities and individual men, women and families.

Please pray and fast for the success of this event. Pray especially that the media will be open to informing the general public about the reality of abortion here in our City. It is taking place at 3pm, the Hour of Mercy, so let us beg God for mercy upon our city and mercy upon any hardened hearts.
